#### **Why choose a NADCA certified company?**

A careless or inadequately trained service provider can damage your ducts or heating and cooling system, possibly increasing your heating and air conditioning costs or forcing you to undertake difficult and costly repairs or replacements”.

#### **In light of this information, who better to provide this cleaning service than a company certified by NADCA?**

Ventilation and Air Duct system Cleaning Companies must meet stringent requirements to become a NADCA Member. Most importantly, all NADCA Members must have certified Air System Cleaning Specialists (ASCS) on staff, who have taken and passed the NADCA Certification Examination. Passing the exam demonstrates extensive

knowledge in HVAC design and cleaning methodologies.

In order to remain a qualified ASCS and a NADCA Member, the specialist must further their industry education by attending seminars yearly. NADCA Members have signed a Code of Ethics stating they will do everything possible to protect the consumer, and follow NADCA Standards for cleaning to the best of their ability.
